- The petitioners made serious grievance regarding plying
 of overloaded goods vehicles on the national highway.

 Apart from the fact that it is in violation of the Motor
 Vehicle Act and the issue raised had, in fact, drawn the
 attention of the Deputy Secretary, Government of West
 Bengal, Transport Department.
- An 'Action taken report' as called for by the Deputy Secretary, Government of West Bengal dated 22nd April,
 2025, should be filed by the Transport Department in the form of an affidavit within three weeks from date.
- 3. One cannot ignore the fact that due to such overloading of goods vehicles, the roads are extensively damaged. Unless strict vigil is maintained by the Administration in not preventing such overloaded goods vehicles to ply, it would not only cause extensive damage to the National Highway and the roads in general, but would also encourage unscrupulous transporters and traders. The

District Magistrates and the Superintendents of Police of all Districts in West Bengal, as well as the National Highway Authority are directed to maintain strict vigil on this and ensure compliance of this direction.

- 4. The order shall be widely circulated for knowledge and compliance by all the stakeholders.
- 5. The matte stands adjourned for **four weeks**.
